

Guidelines to Authors
Rostaniha (Botanical Journal of Iran)
(Systematics and Biodiversity of Fungi and Plants)

Rostaniha aims at publishing original full-length and short articles, review articles, monographs and book reviews in systematics and biodiversity of fungi and plants in its broader sense. Short articles and short reports (including text, figures and tables) must not exceed 5 and 2 printed pages, respectively.

1. Articles must be original and not already published or simultaneously submitted to other journals.
2. Articles can be either in Persian or in English. Persian articles should have English abstract and English articles should have Persian abstract (for Persian articles see Persian guidelines).
3. Text (excluding figures and table) should be sent with a title, names of authors and their addresses, emails, telephone numbers, affiliations and academic ranks should be submitted on A4 pages with 1.5 line spacing. Use 10 points Times New Roman font. All submitted materials must be digitized and submitted online (rostanihajournal.ir) electronically, with the manuscript ideally in Microsoft Word 2003. Illustrations [line drawings (bitmap, 1200 dpi or higher) and half tone pictures (300 dpi or higher)] should be submitted as Adobe files (layers left unflattened, to allow lettering to be added to figures during layout) and NEVER embedded in MSWord or as PowerPoint files. Phylogenetic trees will only be accepted when submitted as PowerPoint or Adobe files.
4. The corresponding author should confirm that: (a) all named authors have agreed to publication of the work; and (b) the manuscript does not infringe any personal or other copyright or property rights.
5. Papers cited as 'in press' should be provided for the benefit of the referees.
6. The content should be structured as follows: Abstract, Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results or Taxonomic Part, Discussion, Acknowledgements and References. Keywords (minimum five words) and a Running Head should also be provided. Abstract should not exceed 200 words (for English) and 250 words (for Persian).
7. English spelling is required, and should follow The Cobuild English Dictionary (Harper Collins Publishers, London).
8. Words of non-English origin, like *et al.*, *fide*, *bona fide*, *prima facie*, *in vitro*, *in situ*, *sensu*, *sensu lato* (*stricto*), should be placed in italic. All Latin names (species and higher levels) are to be placed in italic.
9. Common abbreviations are as follows: h, min, s, mL, μ L, mg/L, °C, Fig., d, wk, but also ITS, RAPD, RFLPs, rDNA, 18S etc.
10. Authorities of taxonomic names should only be written for the first time in the general text. Authorities for taxa should follow the list of authors' names; see <http://www.speciesfungorum.org/AuthorsOfFungalNames.htm> and <http://www.mycobank.org> (for Fungi) and <http://www.ipni.org/index.html> (for Plants). Journal abbreviations in the text (species synonymies, descriptions, etc.) should follow the International Plant Name Index (see <http://www.ipni.org/index.html>).
11. Experimental procedures must be reproducible and must follow *Good Cultural Practice* (Mycological Research 106: 1378–1379), with sequences lodged at *GenBank*, alignments in *TreeBase*, voucher specimens in a registered herbarium (IRAN), or another recognized on-line herbarium (*Index Herbariorum* or *World Directory of Collections and Cultures of Microorganisms* acronym, with accession numbers where allocated, and accompanying ex-type and other cultures in IRAN, CBS or other culture collections. For new fungal taxa or names a *Mycobank* number is required (see www.Mycobank.org).
12. Collections must be cited as:
Specimens examined. COUNTRY, location, substratum, date (e.g. 10 Dec. 2010), *collector* (e.g. D. Ershad & M. Abbasi) HERBARIUM number (acronym according to *Index Herbariorum*), holotype, culture ex-type IRAN xxx. (thus only country in small caps and specimen collector + number italics; everything else in roman type).
13. Reference citation in text: References in the text should be chronological, and given in the following form: 'Smith & Jones (1965) have shown ...', or, 'some authors (Ellis 1960, Taylor & Palmer 1970, Zabetta 1970) consider that ...'. The names of collaborating authors are joined by an ampersand (&). Where there are three or more authors, names should be cited by the first name only, adding '*et al.*', e.g. 'Bowie, Black & White (1964)' are given as 'Bowie *et al.* (1964)' or '(Bowie *et al.* 1964)'. Where authors have published more than one work in a year, to which reference is made, they should be distinguished by placing a, b, etc. immediately after the date, e.g. 'Dylan (1965a, b)'. Reference citations in text should be in ascending order of year first, followed by authors' names. In the References section, citations should be strictly alphabetical, with papers having the same authors arranged according to date. Each reference should include the full title of the paper and journal, volume number, and the final as well as the first page number. In the case of chapters in books, the names of editors, first and last page numbers of the articles, publisher and place of publication are needed.
